

The entrance, as well as the first leg of Tierra Grande, has been a “work in progress” for many months now. Both the Board and United Continental made a commitment to improve the entryway back in the fall of 2009. The Landscape Committee: Carl Rempe, Brian Beeles, and Art Baumann- worked diligently to gather bids, but in the end, they did much of the work themselves. (pictures below)

A big THANK YOU to Neil Roe and United Continental, who paid for the majority of the improvements!! They paid to have the entrance structures, as well as two sheds, completely re-stuccoed. They also hired Mike Fazzio, who did a nice job running the back hoe, removing dead trees at the entrance and down Tierra Grande. He removed a lot of other debris as well, including a large, old water tank near the entrance area.

After weeks of removal and clean up, the entry structures were patched, re-stuccoed, and then given a beautiful terra cotta color coat.

Carl and Brian worked on the letters, which had to be taken down, taken apart, completely refurbished, and finally, repainted. As you can see from the pictures, a striking turquoise color was chosen for the letters. Carl, Brian, Art, and Al Bolkovac spent hours putting the “new” letters back into place.

Now the entrance looks very neat, clean, and inviting. The combination of terra cotta and turquoise colors creates a Southwestern charm!
